WHAT IS LEQVIO?

LEQVIO (inclisiran) is an injectable prescription medicine used along with diet and exercise to reduce low-density lipoprotein (LDL-C) or "bad" cholesterol in adults with high blood cholesterol levels called hypercholesterolemia (including a type of high cholesterol called heterozygous familial hypercholesterolemia [HeFH]).

How to get your LEQVIO® injection at an Alternate Site of Care (ASOC)

Your doctor will contact the ASOC and send them your information.

Then, an ASOC coordinator will:



Call you.

The ASOC coordinator will call you from an unknown number. Make sure to answer the call and have your insurance information ready.



Verify your insurance.

The ASOC coordinator will perform a benefits investigation/verification to determine your out-of-pocket cost, if any, and provide information on any co-pay assistance programs.



Schedule your appointment.

The ASOC coordinator will schedule your LEQVIO appointment. Two visits may be required—one as an initial visit for assessment and another to receive your first LEQVIO injection.



Keep working together with your doctor. They will still oversee your treatment.
